MORO BAY STATE PARK

PRESENTS PROGRAM

Paul Butler the Superintendent at Moro Bay State Park presented a program on the park. He explained that Moro Bay State Park is one of 52 Arkansas State Parks and one of 40 manned state parks. Mr. Butler said that Arkansas has one of the best state park systems in the nation. This is due in part to Amendment 75, Arkansas's 1/8 cent conservation tax, which helps pay for Arkansas State Parks, The Game and Fish Commission, Arkansas Heritage and Keep Arkansas Beautiful.

Mr. Butler advised the Board that people come to Moro Bay State Park to swim, fish, and hike. People come to utilize the river, the bay and the lake where all three bodies of water and three counties come together.

Mr. Butler discussed the history of the ferry at Moro Bay. He explained that the old ferry started in 1828 as the William Burks Ferry. Then in 1965 the Highway Dept. took it over. In 1992 the ferry closed because the bridge was built. At that time the Highway Dept. donated the ferry and the ramp to the park. It is now an exhibit.

Mr. Butler explained Moro Bay State Park's interpretive theme, which is educating the public and helping them to make a connection to the Park's resources. He stated that visitors come to Moro Bay State Park for many reasons; for recreation, to explore the rich flora and fauna created by the waterways and some come because of the area's history.

Mr. Butler explained that the park has 20 campsites on Raymond Lake with water and electricity. The park has a bathhouse with hot showers, a marina which is the only place on the Ouachita River (in Arkansas) that sells gas, two small trails, an outdoor pavilion and a Visitors Center/ pavilion/Assistance Residence, two playgrounds, two day camps and a maintenance shop. Mr. Butler showed slides of the inside and outside of the available cabins at Moro Bay State

Mr. Butler discussed the programs and events offered by the park, such as "bring an alligator to school or bring a snake to school." The park does a variety of educational tours, hikes and boat tours for groups. Mr. Butler discussed some to the park's special events. Such as "First Day Hike" in January, "School Days" in April, "Perch Jerk Classic Fishing Tournament" in June, boating education in June, river cleanup in September and "Holiday/Christmas in the Park" in December. Two of their largest events are the Perch Jerk Classic and the Holiday/Christmas in the

Park, Mr. Butler stated that

the park's programming is hands-on and designed to represent Moro Bay State Park. The programs discuss the park's rich history such as the history of the Ferry, the Hunter and Dunbar expedition of 1804 after the Louisiana Purchase among other topics. Mr. Butler discussed the importance of explaining to kids and others why we have state parks because if it is not understood why we have parks we may loose our parks.

He noted that the park is always looking for volunteers. And many people volunteer for the Day Camps, Park Cleanups, Good Sams, and the Holiday event.

Mr. Butler discussed their Resource Conservationist projects. These projects include; inventorying of the park's woody species, recycling project, little cutting & no burning this year and selection of native plants. He showed map slides of Moro Bay State Park and discussed the layout of the park and their Resource Conservation projects.

Mr. Butler stated that "the Park is about making memories that will last a lifetime. Arkansas State Parks are in the forever business."
